- 2) Using the following link: <u>https://www.un.org/en/genocideprevention/genocide.shtml</u> review Raphael Lemkin's definition of genocide that the United Nations adopted in 1948, so that you have an understanding of what the parameters of the term are.
- Read the IWitness Foundation briefs (see attachment) on the following massacre/genocides: Nanjing Massacre Rwandan Genocide Armenian Genocide Cambodian Genocide Holocaust
- 4) Once you have read all 5 briefs, select one of the genocides or massacre and using the vetted site provided, research and read or view one survivor testimony from the massacre/genocide.
- 5) In a Word Document, respond to the following questions:
 - 1) Name of genocide/massacre
 - 2) When & where this atrocity occurred
 - 3) Who the Perpetrators & Victims were
 - 4) Number of deaths & any other atrocities associated with the genocide/massacre
 - 5) In paragraph format, briefly identify the survivor whose testimony you read/viewed and what this person experienced.
 - 6) In paragraph format, record your opinion regarding how this genocide/massacre violates the dignity and rights of humans & how your investigation has altered or grown your perspective of genocide.

Be prepared to share what you have learned & your reaction to the information when class begins. This will count as your 1st Q1 HR grade.
