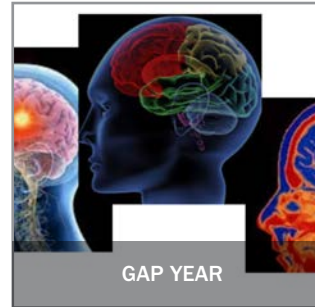
For my project, I learned about the field of physical therapy through research, volunteering, and interviews to assure that it would be the right path for me in college.

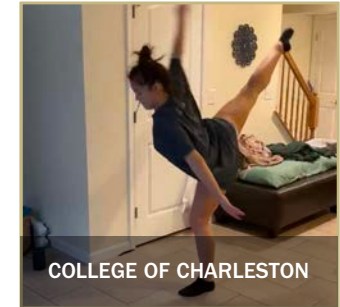

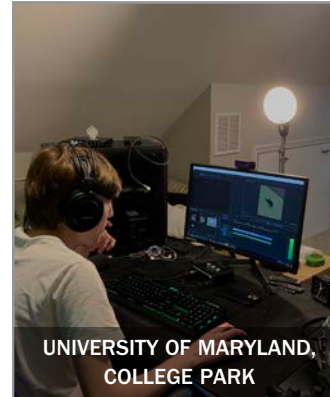

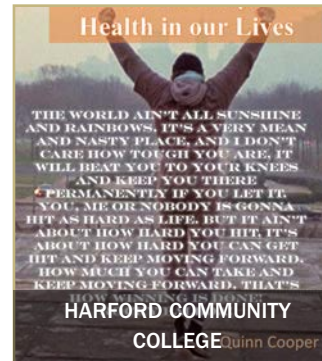
My Senior Project truly allowed me to discover more about the brain and my passion for dance, combining two areas of study that I wish to pursue one day.

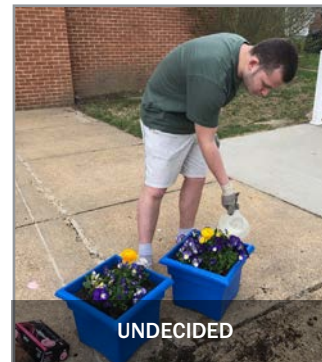

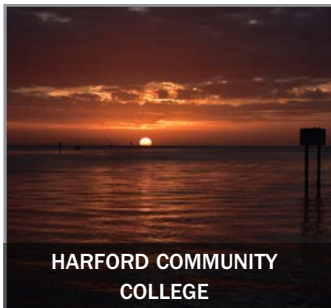

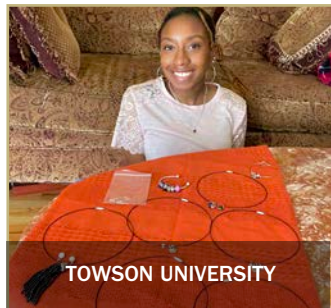

Through Senior Project, I learned about gluten and dairy allergies/sensitivities and found alternatives for people like myself.

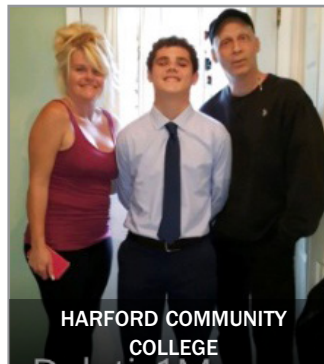

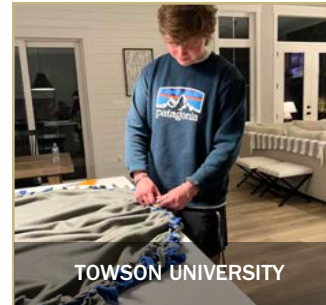
For my Senior Project I created an online business that I plan to operate once I graduate. The business involves creating designs for a clothing line. My goal was to eventually build a successful business.

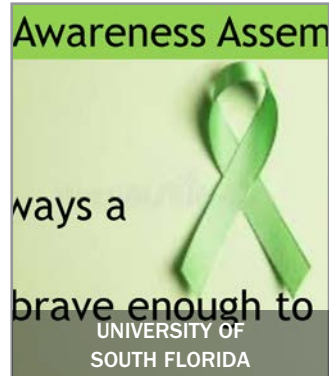
The purpose of my Senior Project was to collect donated fabric and make blankets for cancer patients at The Upper Chesapeake Kaufman Cancer Center.

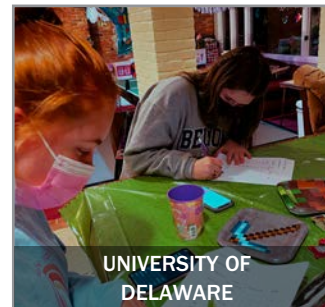
For my Senior Project, I completed the Potomac River Run Half Marathon, which required hard work, dedication and endurance.

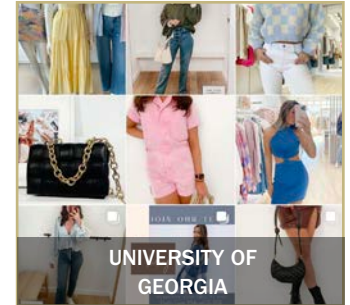
I smoked beef, pork, chicken, lamb, fish and more for my Senior Project.
